LEISURE ROUTE INFORMATION

1. National Botanic Gardens, situated on the slopes of Black Mountain, is devoted almost exclusively to Australian Flora. The gardens were opened by the them Prime Minister, Sir John Gorton on the 20 October 1970. There are a number of marked trails through the reserve with display areas and a bookshop. Visitors should obtain a pamphlet to enhance their visit even further.

Open daily 9.00am - 5.00pm.

Facilities - Toilets, kiosk, picnic tables, wood barbeque (adjacent to the Gardens; drinking water.

- 2. Black Mountain Peninsula situated on the northern section of the Lake Burley Griffin. Sand beaches and safe swimming in a pontoon area are features of this large popular park land. Childrens play equipment is also provided. Open at all times. Facilities Gas barbeques, picnic tables, toilets, drinking water, swimming and childrens playground.
- 3. Scrivener Dam completed in 1964 the dam holds back the water of the Molonglo River to form Lake Burley Griffin. From this point you can walk to a viewing platform for a view of Government House Yarralumla and the surrounding gardens. Facilities Toilets, picnic area.
- 4. Woden Town Centre Developed as the Valley's major shopping complex and retail outlet. Also houses a number of Government Departments, Clubs and sporting facilities. The Interchange controls all bus services to and from Woden, Westen Creek and Tuggeranong areas. Further information may be obtained from the information officer at the Interchange.
- 5. Gooleman Court was developed within the Weston Creek area as a major shopping centre for the district also including food outlets, service stations and club facilities.
- 6. Casuarina Sands located on the Murrumbidgee River and is a popular local swimming area. Facilities - kiosk, shower/toilet block, childrens playground, open and gas filled barbeques.
- Cotter Reserve includes an area around the Dam which was built between 1912 and 1915 and was Canberra's first major construction work.

Facilities – swimming areas, both open and gas barbeques, toilet and shower facilities, kiosk, restaurant and camping facilities.

PICNIC ADVICE

FIRE PRECAUTIONS - Fires should only be lit in designated fireplaces.

During total fire bans no barbeque (wood, gas or electric) may be used. Such bans are advertised on radio and in the press.

GAS AND ELECTRIC BARBEQUES - These units are provided at many urban sites. The temperature is pre-set and requires no adjustment. Gas barbeques accept 10¢ coins and electric barbeques 20¢ coins. Between 20¢ - 40¢ should be enough for an average family meal.

LITTER - Pleasant picnic sites quickly become degraded if all users fail to control litter. Please place all litter in the bins provided. Annual litter collection costs in Camberra are considerable and your assistance will help to reduce these costs substantially.

ACTION hopes you enjoy your day using Route 903.

Most of the points of interest in Canberra can be visited using scheduled ACTION routes. Route 904 operates to the Telecom Tower on Black Mountain during school holidays. Visit any ACTION Interchange to obtain more details and timetables.

Route 903

1. Australian National Botanic Gardens

Situated on the slopes of Black Mountain the Gardens feature the national collection of Australia's native flora. There are a number of marked trails through the Gardens with display areas and a bookshop. Open daily: 9 am-5 pm.

2. Black Mountain Peninsula.

This urban park is situated on the northern section of Lake Burley Griffin. Sand beaches and safe swimming in a pontoon area are features of this large popular park.

3. Museum of Australia and Scrivener Dam

Between the Black Mountain Peninsula and the Sprivener Dam you will pass, at Yarramundi Beach, the site for the Museum of Australia. Sprivener Dam holds back the water of the Molonglo River to form Lake Burley Griffin.

4. Weston Park

An extensive mature Lakeshore park adjacent to the Yarralumla Nursery which supplies trees and shrubs for landscaping Canberra. Weston Park has small sandy beaches, creative playground equipment, including forts and tree-houses, miniature railway and a maze.

5. Woden Interchange

The ACTION Suburban bus service reflects Canberra's land use distribution and road system. Canberra consists of four towns, each with a town centre and bus interchange (or one planned). ACTION's feeder bus routes run into the interchanges and the inter-town express route 333 link the town centre inter-town express route 333 link the town centre interchanges. If, on your return from Cotter and Casuarina Sands you wish to visit Woden Shopping Square, one of the largest fully enclosed shopping centres in Australia, just get off 'The Cotter' bus at Woden and, later on in the day, catch any 333 intertown bus from platform 9, back to the City. Intertown buses leave for City every 15 minutes throughout the day.

6. Cooleman Court

This area was developed within the Weston Creek group of suburbs as the major shopping centre for the district.

7 Casuarina Sands


Located on the Murrumbidgee River, the Sands is a popular location for swimming and canoning.

8. Cotter Recreation Area.

Very attractive picnic areas have been established at the Cotter Pool and Cotter Dam, both located on the Cotter River, a tributary of the Murrumbidgee River.

The Cotter Dam was built between 1912 and 1915 to provide a water supply for the new National Capital—Camberra's first major construction project.

Facilities: Toilets are located at all the above locations. With the exception of Scrivener Dam, all parks and recreation areas feature barbeques and picnic areas. Kiosks are situated at the Botanic Gardens, Casuarina Sands and the Cotter Recreation Area.
