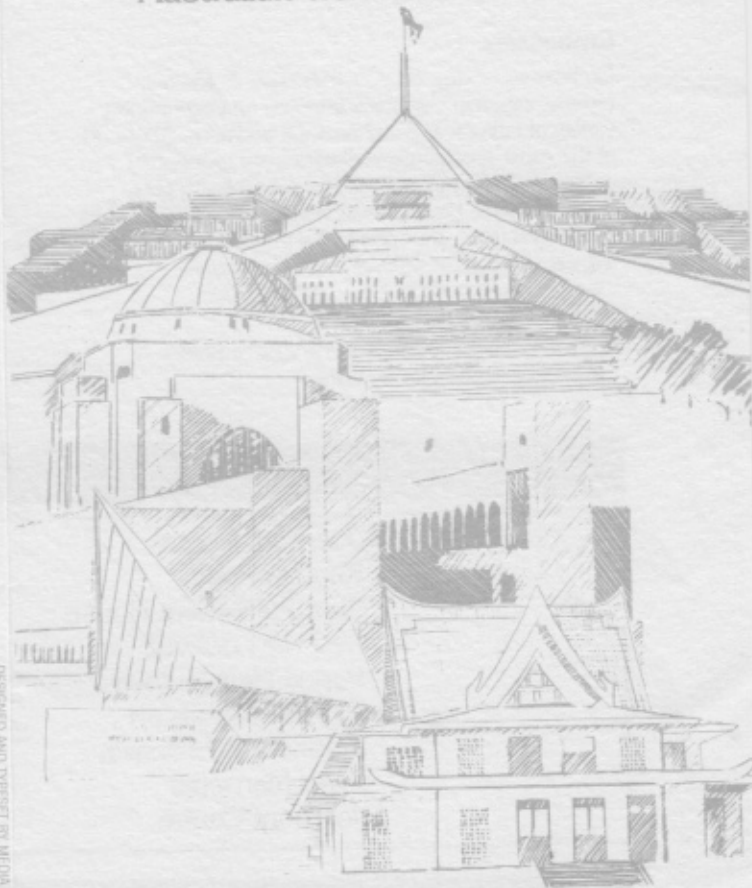

Regatta Point Exhibition

Regatta Point Exhibition — the National Capital Development Commission's Canberra Planning Exhibition at Regatta Point is the ideal place to start your sightseeing. As well as a comprehensive, multi-screen audio visual presentation of Canberra, past, present and future there is a multitude of photographs, maps and diagrams and a large model of the area showing buildings and landmarks in 3 dimensions.

Embassies

Embassies — over 60 countries have diplomatic representation in Canberra, bringing an extraordinary variety of cultural and architectural traditions. About 30 of the most spectacular embassies are grouped in eastern Yarralumla and the bus will take you past many of them. The Indonesian and Papua New Guinea cultural pavilions are open to the public and the bus will stop for a short while at these embassies.

Red Hill Lookout

Red Hill Lookout — offers a fine view of South Canberra and the Woden Valley.

New Parliament House

New Parliament House — one of the highlights of Australia's Bicentenary Celebrations in 1988 will be the opening of the New Parliament House. Alongside the building site is the Exhibition Centre which houses displays of the construction including photographs, architects drawing and a large model of the new building.

Australian War Memorial

Australian War Memorial — the memorial is a tribute to Australians who have died in the service of their country. On show are relics from two World Wars, the Korean and Vietnam wars and other conflicts. The careful collection and dramatic display of the exhibits coupled with the reverential design of the building and its great halls, puts it among the leading museums of its kind in the world.
